The double line has declined substantially and is now restricted largely to south-west England and southern Wales. The Greater London population is therefore extremely important, being the last remaining in eastern England. The moth is found in acid grasslanddominated glades in open woodland, with colonies in Richmond Park and on Wimbledon Common. Both sites are Metropolitan SINC and SSSI.
