Citation:

Hedgehog fungus grows mainly on wounds of old living trees and the ends of felled trunks. It is normally seen high up on the host tree, which is usually beech (occasionally oak or hornbeam). Fruiting bodies appear in late summer to autumn. An extremely local species in the UK, hedgehog fungus is restricted to woodland and old parkland with a continuous presence of mature trees. Past harvesting may have contributed to the current scarcity of this prized edible species, which originally prompted its legal protection. However, it can now be



successfully cultivated for sale in restaurants. This rare fungus has a UK stronghold in Greater London's Epping Forest (LB Redbridge/Waltham Forest).

Conservation priorities:

- Ensure continued favourable management of known sites, ensuring long-term continuity of suitable host trees
- Consider translocations to suitable host trees in appropriate situations
- Monitor populations and habitat quality in known sites for this species
- Enforcement of legal protection, especially in relation to collection of fruiting bodies
- Protect any new sites emerging from further surveys
